Guidelines

Submissions are invited for themed session presentations. Presentations should be 15 minutes in length, followed by a 5-10 minute question period, in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Abstracts should be no more than 250 words.
- The bio should not exceed 100 words.
- Submissions should be made online.
- Applicants selected for participation will be contacted in due time.
- English is the official language of the conference.
- Selected papers will be considered for publication by the scientific committee.
- Selected papers will be peer reviewed and published.
